Leaders understand that society could, at any time, descend into another period bereft of enlightenment, another Dark Ages as it were. And therefore, leaders understand that whatever else they accomplish, the most important thing they bequeath to society is the perpetuation of leadership itself.

The Elephant in the Room

The Left and the Dismantling of Society

How do great societies crumble? It's an interesting question. Athens. Rome. The Mayan civilization. . . Historians have wrestled with such questions from time immemorial.

The United States is the greatest society ever produced in human history, thanks to the sacrifices and genius of men like George



Washington, Benjamin Franklin, Alexander Hamilton, James Madison, Thomas Jefferson, and John Adams.

Yet America is under attack, not due to a foreign power from without, but due to a cancer from within. I call that cancer Leftism. The proponents of this contagion think of themselves as "Progressives" (which epitomizes the very notion of irony.)

How bad is Leftism on American culture and society? Let's review. The following news stories were all published in the single month of December 2021. Read through this list and try to come to grips at just how much damage can be done by the Left in one calendar month.

Abortion

• Kate Cohen, an outspoken atheist and a columnist for the *Washington Post*, argued for the glories of abortion, claiming, among other things that <u>babies do not have</u>

<u>souls</u>, that fetuses are nothing more than a "clump of cells," and that such babies, when aborted, do not feel anything, and certainly not pain.

Blasphemy

- Leftist radicals posing as school administrators who run the Fairfax County library in Virginia, set up a holiday reading display for the Christmas season. Obviously, they needed to include the Holy Bible in that display. But they decided it would be cute if they flanked that Bible by two books featuring gay pornography, so they placed a copy of Gender Queer and a copy of Lawn Boy in the display as well, as both of those books have been under scrutiny for being accessible for students as young as 7th grade in some Virginia schools.
- A pastor from Indiana lost his mind and decided to exchange his pastoral robes for the garb of a drag gueen dancer on an HBO show that peddles perversity.
- The Bibelhaus, a Bible museum located in Frankfurt, Germany, put forth to the public various LGBTQIA+ displays that attempted to turn legitimate Bible themes into gay propaganda. They even put on a play that <u>presented Jesus as transgender</u>. It is unknown if these people had any Bible readings of Leviticus 18:22 or Romans 1:27.

Covid-19 Insanity

- A woman named Norma Garcia-Lopez is a member of the Fort Worth, Texas school board's Racial Equity Committee. In response to a mother who sued the school district over their Covid-19 mask mandate, Mr. Garcia-Lopez retaliated by <u>releasing the personal information</u> of that mother, along with the personal information of other parents with similar views, and went further by leaving a profanity-laced voicemail message attacking that mother. Ms. Garcia-Lopez is not only a despicable human being with no sense of common courtesy, but she is also unintelligent, in that she claimed she was not guilty of "doxing" the mother in question by saying, "It's not doxxing when you expose someone who filed a public motion in a public court of law that impacts public school children." In other words, doxxing isn't doxxing if you can justify doxxing in your own mind.
- As time went on, we learned that Left-Wing spin-masters <u>colluded with the media</u> to churn out misinformation on the origins of Covid-19.

Crime

- While crime skyrockets under the leadership of radicalized Democrats, the Leftist Dems claim no such spike in crime is taking place, meaning they are either delusional or simply lying to the public. Philadelphia District Attorney Larry Krasner, who loves criminals and hates the law abiding, insisted "We don't have a crisis of lawlessness, we don't have a crisis of crime, we don't have a crisis of violence." Oh? Philadelphia has seen a 13% jump in homicides compared to 2020 and the city's highest number of killings since at least 2007. Likewise, shooting incidents and shooting victims have both risen over the rate recorded in 2020. Armed robberies have shot up 27% since 2020. Similarly, New York City Mayor Bill de Blasio bragged about how much safer the city is since he has been mayor, in spite of the fact that hate crimes and the murder rate have increased under his tenure.
- Due to Left-wing policies on bail reform, a savage criminal was released from jail for the brutal beating of an innocent man. Once released, he immediately committed

<u>another</u> savage, unprovoked attack on two more women, and was quickly released from that second attack again -- all by Left-wing New York lawmakers who are gleeful when crime is committed.

- A Christmas Tree located just outside the Fox News headquarters in New York City
 was burned to the ground in an act of arson. The suspect, Craig Tamanaha, was
 arrested and promptly released. Again, criminals are basically rewarded for
 committing crime by Leftist prosecutors who are gleeful when crime is committed.
- Jacqueline Avant, age 81, the wife of music executive Clarence Avant, was brutally murdered inside her Beverly Hills home when a thug named Aariel Maynor broke in and shot her dead with an AR-15 rifle. Mr. Maynor was out on parole with a very long rap sheet that included robbery, domestic violence, grand theft, along with other crimes. And how did the LA District Attorney, George Gascon, react to all of this? Gascon felt that the justice system failed the murderer, not the victim. Gascon went even further: we learned of a case in Los Angeles where a man was charged with kidnapping, domestic violence, engaging in intercourse with a minor, and having an outstanding warrant, and yet DA George Gascon recommended zero bail so that the man could be free to commit more crime.
- Burlington, Vermont agreed to slash its police force by nearly 30% due to pressure from the Black Lives Matter radicals. And as a result, the city has become <u>a very</u> <u>unsafe place</u> to live.
- In Florida, a criminal who was given probation by Left-wing prosecutors used his new-found freedom to go out and <u>murder three innocent children</u> by running over them in his car.
- In the state of Washington, a bill has ben introduced by radicalized Left-wing zealots to reduce penalties against drive-by shooters. Why? Because these lawmakers believe most drive-by shooters are black, and it's <u>racist to put black</u> <u>murderers in jail.</u>

Fake News

- The Washington Post claimed that President Biden gets worse treatment from the Press than did President Donald Trump. I need not say more. Even with this brazenly fake news, Nikole Hannah-Jones, author of the fake news 1619 project, came out and urged journalists to be more biased against conservatives, because they are too neutral.
- Fact-Checkers in the mainstream media <u>continued to get their facts wrong</u>, and interestingly, every single time they got it wrong, the so-called analysis supported Left-wing ideology. Conclusion: The fact checkers are fake; they are Left-wing propagandists.
- And, of course, the mainstream media did not disappoint with their consistent fake news propaganda. 10 of their most blatant examples of misleading reporting are described here.

Pedophilia

 It was reported that CNN producer John Griffin, age 44, had spent a number of years <u>engaging in pedophilia</u>. He would seduce girls as young as 9 years old and somehow con their mothers into participating in such evil. He claimed to believe that a "woman is a woman regardless of her age" and that they needed to be trained properly -- by him. A middle school tech specialist named Krista Tyler who teaches at Grisham Middle School in Austin, Texas read a Dr. Seuss-style poem she authored mocking evangelicals and other religious people who had expressed concerns about the presence of pornographic books that include pedophilia content in the school library. One can only conclude that Ms. Tyler believes 12 year olds should have exposure to material written by pedophiles.

Racism

- For a group of people who are constantly falsely labeling everyone else a racist, these people are shameless and brazen in their own racist proclivities. The radicalized group who ingeniously (and deceptively) call themselves Black Lives Matter began the month by calling for a national boycott of what they refer to as "white companies." And, complicit in this racism were many of the major donors to BLM, by remaining silent in the face of this blatant racism, including Microsoft, Amazon, Intel, and many other organizations run by politically-correct cowards.
- GoFundMe jumped onto the Black Lives Matter bandwagon when they took down a GoFundMe page of a decorated Army sergeant was trying to cover his legal costs after being charged with the murder of a BLM leader. - Perhaps the most demented story of the month involving Leftist racism involves the Campbell Union High School District in California which <u>urged students to practice</u> <u>witchcraft</u> on any students who claim "All lives matter" by putting a hex on them. One doesn't know whether to laugh or cry.
- A USA Today column asked, with a straight face, whether math is racist. I was not
 aware that math had an opinion about the color of people's skin, but to one writer
 at USA Today, math, as a scientific subject based on natural laws and formulations,
 may well have volition that is racist. Nice.
- Nikole Hannah-Jones, who is the "brains" behind the thoroughly discredited 1619
 Project, which seeks to paint the United States as systemically racist, had the
 temerity to claim that the mainstream media, an entity that is as committed to Left wing causes as she is, is involved in a propaganda campaign against her phony
 project. This simply demonstrates that the Left often bites the hand that feeds
 them.
- The Salvation Army, formerly a respectable organization that helped the poor, decided to jump on the "woke" bandwagon and propagate the idea that America is racist. They <u>published a racism guide</u> on their website that read like it was straight from a Left-wing play book. As a result, their donations have plummeted and they, thankfully, removed the propaganda from their website. But the damage was done.
- A Michigan school district, thanks to Leftist indoctrination, now claims calling the United States a land of opportunity is a micro-aggression. This same district insisted

that teachers join a Black Lives Matter protest.

- A dean at San Diego State University declared that the <u>agenda of conservatives is</u> <u>racism</u>, unintelligence, and inequality, oblivious to the fact that it is Left-wing administrators that routinely have segregated college dorms and graduation ceremonies.
- In Virginia, Critical Race Theory continued to be pushed down the throats of students, with the intent to paint <u>all white students as racist</u> by nature and to paint black students as victims.

Pronunciation: lärjes, lärŻHes




